One company's value chain is embedded in a larger stream of activities that can be considered the supply chain or as Porter mentions it: the Value System. Suppliers have a value chain (upstream value) that create and deliver the purchased inputs. In addition, many products pass through the value chain of channels (channel value) on their way to the buyer.
